Now that's the way you eat spaghetti.

FROM THE KITCHEN OF ... Julia Child and Dick Moore Sticky Toffee Pudding Serves 6 1-4 c. all-purpose flour 1 t. baking powder 1-1/2 t. apple pie spice 1/2 t. salt 4 T. unsalted butter, plus more for ramekins 6 oz. dried Medjool dates, pitted, roughly chopped 1 t. baking soda 3/4 c. granulated sugar 3 eggs, lightly beaten 1 t. pure vanilla extract Eggnog, for serving Store-bought or homemade salted caramel sauce, for serving

Preheat oven to 350 degrees, butter 6 4-0z. ramekins. In a bowl, combine flour, baking powder, apple pie spice and salt, whisk well. In a medium saucepan, combine, the dates and 1-1/4 cups water; bring to simmer and cook until dates are soft, about 10 minutes. Add baking soda, and mix well to combine. The mixture will foam up. Meanwhile, cream the butter and sugar with an electric mixer until pale and fluffy, about 3-5 minutes. Beat in eggs and vanilla until well combined, about 2 minutes more. Add the date mixture and the dry ingredients to the butter mixture, a third of each at a time, mixing after each addition. Divide batter among ramekins, filling each no more than 3/4 full. Place ramekins on a baking sheet, and bake 30 to 50 minutes, until set. Turn out hot puddings into serving bowls. Pour eggnog around the base of the pudding and drizzle with salted caramel sauce; serve immediately.

Opinion of Brown Stripe in Pride Flag

The rainbow flag has never represented "Peoples" of any color but it is "representative of the refracted sunlight in the rainbow which includes all colors.

Rainbow Flags have a long history and have represented various historical ideas and movements. In that train of history, a Rainbow Flag only recently became a banner of the LGBT. When the Gay Community adopted the Rainbow Flag, its original intention was to express pride and unity in diversity. The following three paragraphs are clips from the internet:

Originally devised by San Francisco artist Gilbert Baker, the design has undergone several revisions since its debut in 1978, first to remove colors then restore them

based on availability of fabrics. The most common variant consists of six stripes; red. orange, yellow, green, blue, and violet. The flag is typically flown horizontally, with the red stripe on top, as it would be in a natural rainbow.

He (Baker) pointed out that the "rainbow" symbolized unity in diversity and the power of light, enlightenment and progress. The first co-op rainbow flag was completed in 1924 and was adopted as an official symbol of the international cooperative movement of 1925.

The rainbow flag, commonly known as the gay pride flag or LGBT pride flag, is a symbol of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) pride and LGBT social movements. Other older uses of rainbow flags include a symbol of peace. The colors reflect the diversity of the LGBT community, as the flag is often used as a symbol of gay pride during LGBT rights marches. While the use of the rainbow flag originated in Northern California's San Francisco Bay Area, the flag is now used worldwide.

I restate: the colors in the PRIDE flag have never represented peoples.

We are all of one race ... The Human Race, which occurs in many hues. To add a brown stripe and/or black stripe and justify that as inclusion just further divides the One Human Race and nurtures the continuance of racism.

If colors in a Gay Flag were to represent the various colors of The Human Race, why would there be blue or green or purple or orange stripe? Would a white stripe have to be added?

When we continue to draw lines through The One Human Race by colors, we repeat the failures of history by insisting on divisive markers which trash the words of Martin Luther King, Jr. The following clip is the closing from Martin Luther King, Jr's "I Have a Dream" speech.

"And when this happens, and when we allow freedom to ring, when we let it ring from every village and every hamlet, from every state and every city, we will be able to speed up that day <u>when **all** of God's</u> children. black men and white men. Jews and Gentiles, Protestants and Catholics, will **JANUARY** . 2019

"Free at last! Free at last! Thank God Almighty, we are free at last!"
