A LEGEND PASSES AWAY



1928 - 2019

Cecil Bethea passed away on the evening of November 1, 2019 at his retirement home in Denver at the ripe old age of 91. Cecil and life partner Carl Shepherd were together for 50 years. They met in 1969, 2 months before Stonewall. They were active members since 1996 with the Colorado Prime Timers. Anyone who knew Cecil cherished him. Cecil could always be counted on for fun, friendly and enlightening conversation. Music, art, history and more.

On one occasion, Cecil and Carl were celebrating their 20th anniversary at a local gay restaurant. Cecil never talked about how long they had been together, but Carl did. When the waiter heard, he became very excited and wanted to know what they did to last so long. Cecil replied, "Got old."

Both Cecil and Carl served in the Air Force in the 1950s. They also worked together at the May D&F Department store downtown.

Cecil was a docent for the Prime Timers and contributed stories to the Newsletter entitled "Brothers of the Past" for many years.

Silver-haired Cecil, in a red plaid jacket

and tie, didn't look much like an anarchist police described during the trials of the DNC protesters. He was 80 years old at the time on August 25, 2008 during the Democratic National Convention as he walked from the Denver library to his bus stop.

He became trapped in a tide of protesters near Civic Center Park and was then detained by police.

Briefcase in hand, he stood and smoked a cigarette with a slight frown, as police fired pepper spray into the chaos of young anarchists surrounding him. Suddenly there was a police barricade on all four sides. He stood there and didn't know what to do. He didn't carry a sign and wasn't shouting, he just stood there and said nothing.

Two police officers drew him from the crowd with his hands tied behind his back and searched him extensively because they were concerned with the contents of the briefcase.

The way they handled him, you would have thought he was a mass murderer or something. Several of the protesters yelled at the police for their handling of him.

He said that they were a little tough with him, especially because he did not represent any danger to them. I don't think anybody would say I look dangerous or scary.

As a resident of Denver for more than 50 years, he said he was on his way home from the library. Police released him after he showed them a library receipt.

They had us all corralled there and somebody said "sit down." He said he just sat there waiting on the curb until one police officer asked him if he was a little old to be protesting, and Cecil told him he wasn't a protester. "Thank God for the receipt with the date on it, because evidently it reads off that I just checked two books out." The police escorted him out through a nearby hotel.

He went and bought a cup of coffee because his throat was dry. He had planned to be an observer, not a participant.

The next morning he read the paper and found out they were anarchists, in his native Alabama voice.

It was a very disappointing riot, Cecil said later. He thought of the riots in Chicago in 1968 and the Detroit riots, and it was really nothing like that. There wasn't a sign, no chanting, singing or anything. We were just sitting there.

There were 60 people tried or were scheduled to be tried on DNC-protest-

related charges.

After he testified, from his understanding, they only convicted one out of many trials. He said that's not a very good batting average.

He of course will be greatly missed. I understand there will be a celebration-of-life to be scheduled at a later date.
